Camp Evergreen is located at the eastern gateway to the majestic Rocky Mountains, a few kilometres south of Sundre, Alberta. Camp Evergreen rests on the banks of Fallen Timber Creek and stewards 480 acres of densely forested land. Camp Evergreen is committed to its founding purpose to encourage kids and youth in faith and community through the adventure of summer camp, and has grown into a year-round, restorative retreat centre, with an emerging focus as a leadership development centre.

The Alberta Conference of Mennonite Brethren Churches officially founded Camp Evergreen in 1963. Over the past sixty years, the camp has continued to grow and develop, offering comprehensive programs and amenities to guests from across Western Canada. Camp Evergreen's statement of faith is available at Camp Evergreen includes a base camp with modern amenities and recreational opportunities including a welcome centre, camp mercantile, multiple cabins and lodging, archery, climbing wall, camping sites, kitchen and dining hall, seasonal outdoor rink, activity centre, yurt accommodations, outdoor firepits, and groomed walking trails. The lower camp offers a ropes course, playing fields, equestrian facilities, petting zoo, canoeing, river aquatics, obstacle course, bike trails, pump track, rustic accommodations, and natural walking trails.

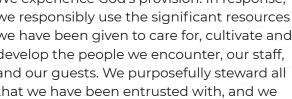
